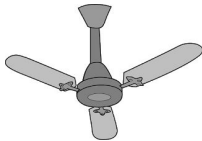

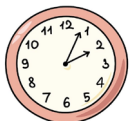

Examples in interrogative.

1. Is there a car in the parking lot?
2. Is there a doctor close to here?
3. Is there a chair in the classroom?

Answers:

No, there isn't...
