THERE IS / THERE ARE

"There is" y "there are" son expresiones en inglés que se usan para indicar la existencia de personas o cosas. " There is" se usa para singular, mientras que " there are" se usa para plural

Uso

"There is" se usa con sustantivos contables en singular y con sustantivos incontables.

"There are" se usa con sustantivos contables en plural.

Ejemplos

"There is one chair in the room" significa "Hay una silla en la habitación".

"There are classes 24/7" significa "En English Live, hay clases 24/7".

Fórmula para formar Wh- questions en presente simple

Wh- word + do o does + el sujeto + forma básica de otro verbo (+ más información)

Ejemplos de preguntas " wh" en presente simple

What is your name? (¿Cuál es tu nombre?)

Where do you work? (¿Dónde trabajas?)

Why are you angry? (¿Por qué estás enojado?)

When is your graduation ? (¿Cuándo es tu graduación?)

Which is your address ? (¿Cuál es tu dirección?)
