SOME/ANY:

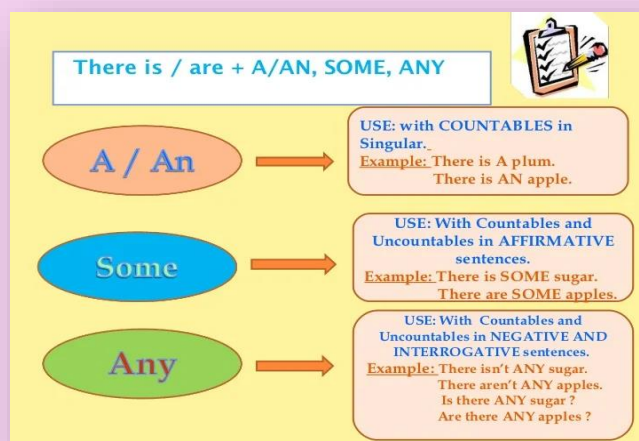
Some se usa en oraciones afirmativas, mientras que Any se usa en oraciones negativas e interrogativas.

- WE HAVE SOME TIME

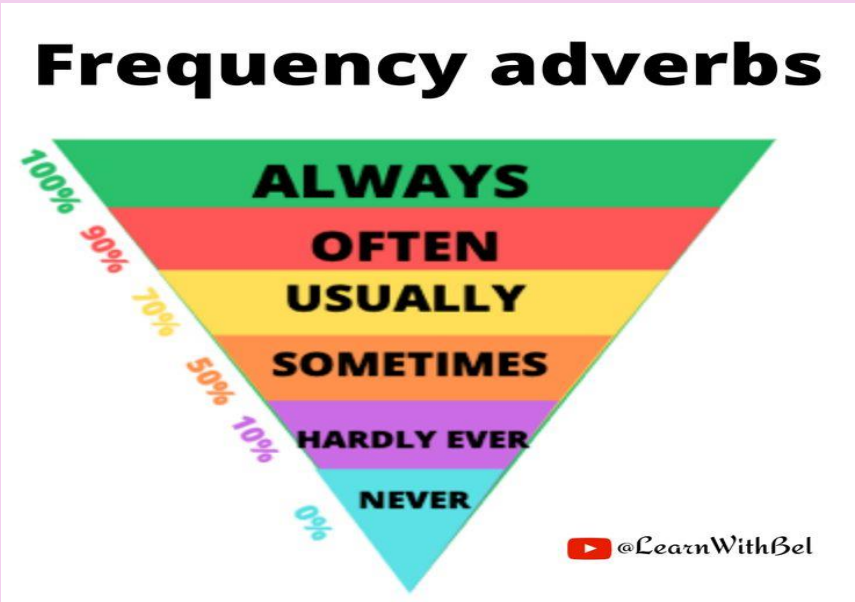


ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY:

words that indicate how often or regularly an action occurs, such as "always," "sometimes," or "never."

EJEMPLOS:

- ❖ MY SISTER **NEVER** LENDS ME HER CLOTHES
- ❖ I **ALWAYS** PLAY VIDEO GAMES
- ❖ My mom **usually** drinks coffee in the morning



CAN FOR ABILITY:

Can" y "can't" son verbos modales en inglés que se usan para expresar habilidad, posibilidad, permiso o prohibición.

EJEMPLOS: (CAN)

- "I can speak English" (Puedo hablar inglés)
- "She can sing" (Ella puede cantar)
