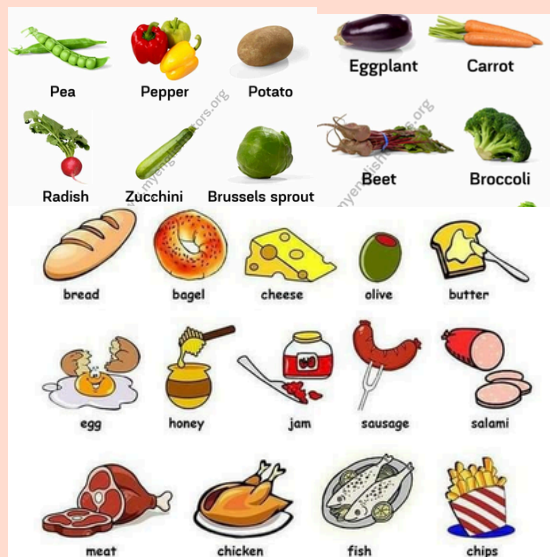

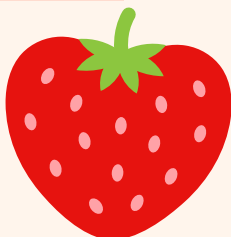

### SOME OR ANY ???

#### SOME

- SOME** is used to mean 'a little' and 'a few'.
- Also, **SOME** can be used with both countable nouns (it means a few) and uncountable nouns (it means a little).
- SOME**, when used with countable nouns, nouns are plural. When used with uncountable nouns, they are always singular.

**Examples**

- I asked her to lend me **some** money.
- I have **some** work to do this evening.
- He will bring **some** friends to the party next week.

#### ANY

- ANY** is used to mean 'no' or 'zero'.
- ANY** can be used with both countable and uncountable names.
- ANY**, when it is used with countable nouns, they are always plural. When it is used with uncountable nouns, they always become singular.

**Examples**

- I will not see him **any** more.
- There isn't **any** butter.
- There aren't **any** clothes in the wardrobe.

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### ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

100%	<b>ALWAYS</b>	He's <b>always</b> very punctual. I'll see if he's here yet.
90%	<b>USUALLY</b>	We <b>usually</b> go to the restaurant on Sundays.
80%	<b>GENERALLY</b>	We <b>generally</b> go to the sea for our holidays.
70%	<b>OFTEN</b>	They <b>often</b> went caroling at Christmas.
50%	<b>SOMETIMES</b>	<b>Sometimes</b> , I just need someone to talk to.
30%	<b>OCCASIONALLY</b>	We <b>occasionally</b> meet for a drink after work.
15%	<b>SELDOM</b>	I have <b>seldom</b> seen such brutality.
5%	<b>RARELY</b>	She is old and <b>rarely</b> goes out.
0%	<b>NEVER</b>	If you don't aim high you will <b>never</b> hit high.

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### Adverbs of frequency using verb To Be

**Affirmative form:**

**"Grammar"**

Subject pronoun → Verb To Be (am/is/are) → Adverb of frequency → Complement

**Examples:**

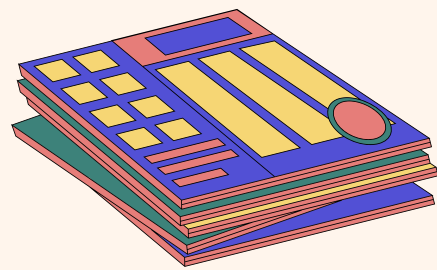
I	am	always	in the school
He	is	sometimes	happy
You	are	seldom	in your home

**"Grammar"**

Subject pronoun → Verb To Be (am/is/are) → Adverb of frequency → Verb+ing → Complement

**Examples:**

I	am	always	speaking	in the school
He	is	sometimes	feeling	nervous
You	are	seldom	running	in the park

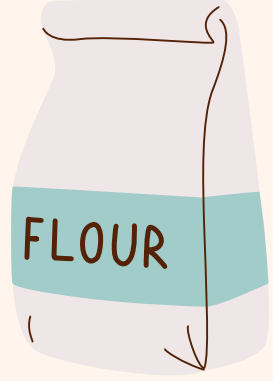

<b>WHY</b>	Asking for a reason Why do you say that?
<b>HOW</b>	Asking about a procedure or method How was your exam?

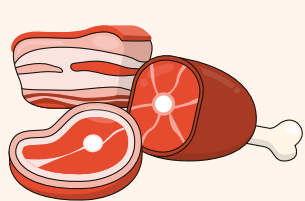
