



Subject + adverb of frequency + verb + complement.

They often meet friends and have a drink together.

Negative.

subject + don't / doesn't + adverb of frequency + verb + complement.

Sara doesn't always go out on saturday evenings.

Interrogative.

Do / Does + subject + adverb of frequency + verb + complement?
