AF IN VERB TO-BE

Affirmative:

Subject + verb to be + adverb of frequency + complement.

Susan is always happy.

Negative:

Subject + verb to be + not + adverb of frequency + complement.

Nick is not usually in México.

Interrogative:

Verb to be + subject + adverb of frequency + complement?

Is Peter usually sick?



Adverbs of frequency.

AF IN PRESENT SIMPLE

Affirmative:

Subject + adverb of frequency + verb + complement.

They often meet friends and have a drink togetter.

Negative:

Subject + don't doesn't + adverb of frequency + verb + complement.

Sara doesn't always go aut on saturday evenings.

Interrogative:

Do Does + subject + adverb of frequency + verb + complement.

Does she usually call her Mother.
