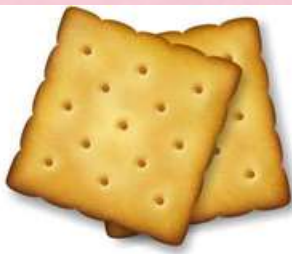

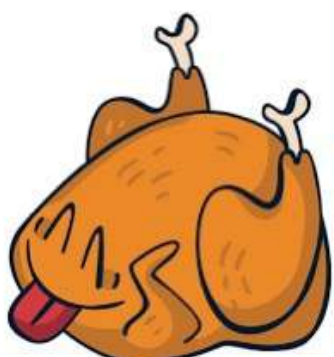

- Siempre en singular, no en plural.
- Se cuentan con unidades de medida o contenedores.

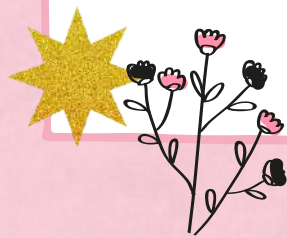

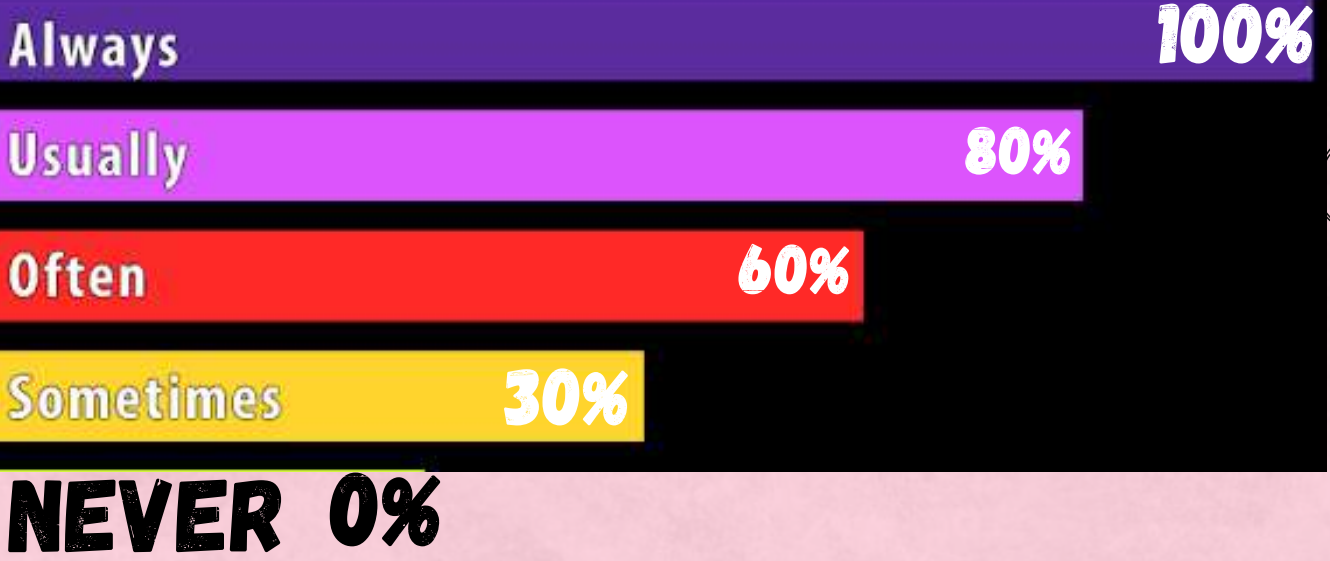
