SOME/ANY

La palabra **some** se usa en:

ORACIONES AFIRMATIVAS

- I need **some** Milk
- Necesito algo de leche

Oraciones interrogativas de sí o no, cuando ofrecemos algo. El uso de **some** en este caso no es obligatorio y simplemente marca que deseamos que la respuesta sea sí (es una fórmula de cortesía).

- Do you want **some** water?
- ¿Quieres un poco de agua?

- Used to mean "**a little**" and "**a few**".
- Used with both countable and uncountable nouns.
- Used with countable nouns, nouns are plural, used with uncountable nouns, they are always singular.

Examples

- I must withdraw **some** money from the bank.
- Lyn sent **some** pictures from the wedding.
- He has bought **some** tropical fruits.

- Used to mean "**no**" or "**zero**".
- Used with both countable and uncountable nouns.
- Used with countable nouns, they are always plural, used with uncountable nouns, they always become singular.

Examples

- The baby can't keep **any** food down.
- You can't go out without **any** shoes.
- I won't give her **any** more if she's ungrateful.

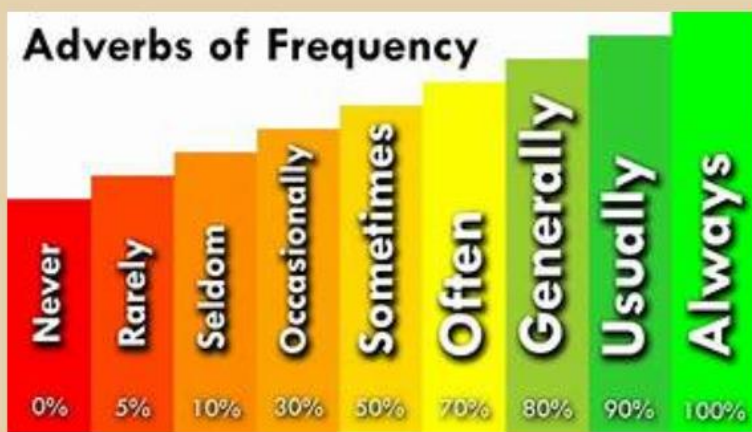
ORACIONES NEGATIVAS

ORACIONES INTERROGATIVAS

- Do you have **any** advice for me?
- ¿Tienes algún consejo para mí?

ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY



ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY		
%	Adverb of Frequency	Example
100%	Always	I always study after class
90%	Usually	I usually walk to work
80%	Normally / Generally	I normally get good marks
70%	Often / Frequently	I often read in bed at night
50%	Sometimes	I sometimes sing in the shower
30%	Occasionally	I occasionally go to bed late
10%	Seldom	I seldom put salt on my food
5%	Hardly ever / Rarely	I hardly ever get angry
0%	Never	Vegetarians never eat meat
Subject + Adverb + Main Verb		Subject + BE + Adverb
Daniel always passes his exams.		He is always happy.

CAN FOR ABILITY.

El verbo “can” se usa para a que algo es posible (refiriéndose a una posibilidad) o que alguien es capaz de realizar una acción (refiriéndose a habilidad). Este verbo se suele utilizar acompañado de un verbo principal en su forma infinitiva.

	Long Form	Short Form	
I can	I cannot	I can't	Can I?
You can	You cannot	You can't	Can you?
He can	He cannot	He can't	Can he?
She can	She cannot	She can't	Can she?
It can	It cannot	It can't	Can it?
We can	We cannot	We can't	Can we?
You can	You cannot	You can't	Can you?
They can	They cannot	They can't	Can they?

Short answers	Can you dance?	Yes, I can./No, I can't.
