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

ORDINAL NUMBERS

Woodward's ENGLISH VOCABULARY

We normally add a TH to the end of a cardinal number to make it an ordinal number. Be careful of the spelling exceptions below:

DATES: Her birthday is on the 29th.

CENTURIES: Shakespeare was born in the 16th century.

SEQUENCE/ORDER: My team came *second* in the league.

FLOORS OF A BUILDING: His office is on the *tenth* floor.

Affirmative form

Subject + To be + Going to + Verb + Complement

Subject	To be	Going to	Verb	Complement
I	am	going to	take	a taxi.
You	are	going to	go	to México City tomorrow.
He	is	going to	study	a master next year.

Examples

1. She is going to visit her grandmother tomorrow.
2. We are going to study for the exam this weekend.
3. I am going to buy a new laptop next month.

Negative form

Subject + To be (not) + Going to + Verb + Complement

Subject	To be (not)	Going to	Verb	Complement
I	am not	going to	watch	movies.
We	aren't	going to	get	married.

Examples

- 1.He is not going to play soccer this afternoon.
- 2.They are not going to travel to Spain this year.
- 3.I am not going to eat pizza tonight.



Interrogative form

To be + Subject + Going to + Verb + Complement

To be	Subject	Going to	Verb	Complement
is	Leslie	going to	buy	a new dress?
are	they	going to	play	tennis?

Examples

- 1.He is not going to play soccer this afternoon.
- 2.They are not going to travel to Spain this year.
- 3.I am not going to eat pizza tonight.
