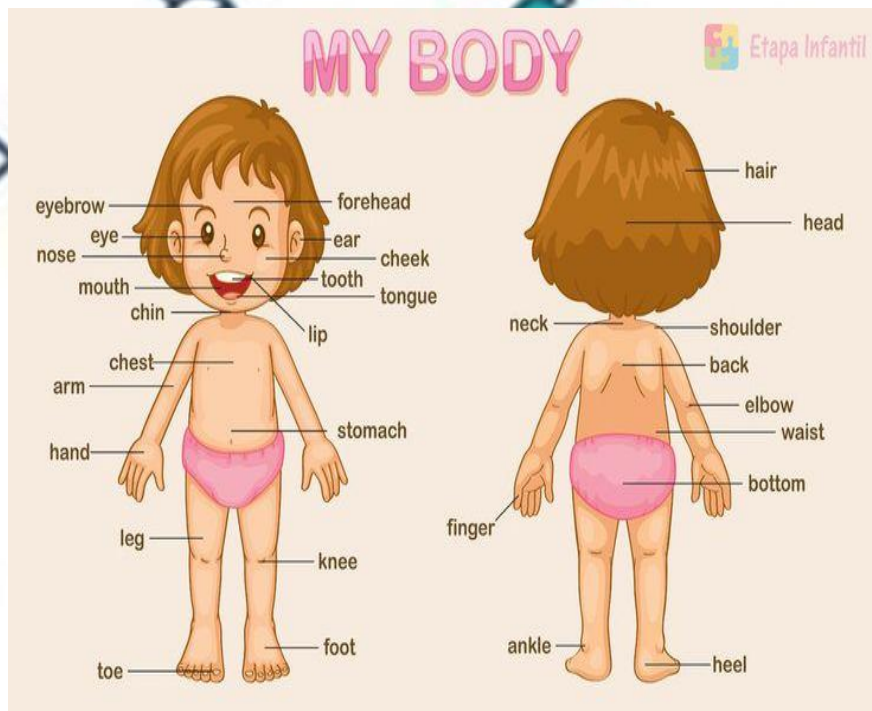

Past simple

Regular and irregular verbs in past simple

Simple	Past	Sentence
Eat	ate	She ate delicious pasta.
Run	ran	They ran a marathon.
See	saw	I saw a shooting star.
Do	did	He did his best.
Have	had	We had a party.
Write	wrote	She wrote a letter.
Break	broke	They broke the vase.
Take	took	He took a photo.
Give	gave	She gave a gift.
Come	came	They came late.
Become	became	He became a doctor.
Make	made	She made a cake.
Find	found	They found the treasure.
Say	said	He said hello.
Get	got	We got tickets.
Know	knew	She knew the answer.
Think	thought	He thought deeply.
See	saw	We saw a rainbow.
Tell	told	She told a story.
Leave	left	They left early.
Swim	swam	They swam competitively.
Win	won	They won the championship.

Afirmative structure

- Subject + base verb (for I/You/We/They)
- Subject + base verb + -s/es (for He/She/It)

Negative structure

Subject + do/does + not + base verb

- Use do not (don't) for I/You/We/They
- Use does not (doesn't) for He/She/It

Interrogative structure

Do/Does + subject + base verb?

- Use Do with I/You/We/They
- Use Does with He/She/It

	Examples
Afirmative form	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ She works at a hospital. ➤ They play soccer every weekend.
Negative form	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ He does not like vegetables. ➤ We do not watch TV at night.
Interrogative form	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Do you read books every day? ➤ Does she live in New York?
